

AZO (1009) – bibliothecarius, cardinal-bishop (Ostia, 1012/1013–1021?)

Name variants: Azo, Azzo, Autius, Actius. There are brief informations concerning his person and career. The place and time of birth is unknown. The *Liber Pontificalis* mentions a certain Ato protoscrinarius in 965, who visited with Narinus, bishop of Sutri the emperor Otto I on Saxony after pope Leo VIII's death to negotiate the election of the new supreme pontiff. They returned to Rome with Otgerus and Liuzi (Liutprand), bishops of Speyer and Cremona, where John, bishop of Narni was elected to pope (John XIII). The accuracy of this information is doubtfull, because the text is a variant of the *Liber Pontificalis*, and its main text does not mention this legation, it highlights the emperor's approval and the election by the people of Rome.¹

He was mentioned as *nuncius* in the founding charter of the bishopric of Pécs (23 August 1009).² Azo became cardinal-bishop of Ostia in 1012 (or in 1013). He assisted to the donation of the monastery of Città Castellano (*S. Sepulchri et SS. Quatuor Evangelistarum, in castro Felicitatis, in loco Noceati*) as cardinal and *bibliothecarius*.³ He died probably in 1021.⁴
